Amerijet was founded in 1974, beginning with a single leased aircraft providing small cargo and passenger flights between the U.S. and The Bahamas. By 1978, Amerijet had expanded its operations to include overnight courier routes, operating a fleet of Falcon 20 aircraft. In 1987, Amerijet

established its hub at Miami International Airport, laying the foundation for what would become the heart of its international operations.





With more than 50 years of experience in the air cargo industry, Amerijet has grown into a leading cargo airline, operating a dedicated fleet of Boeing 767-300 freighters from its hub at Miami International Airport. 
In the United States and Canada, Amerijet links key cities to its Miami hub, which features a state-of-the-art cargo facility



Scheduled Service

Scheduled Service transports time-sensitive, perishable, oversized, hazardous, and highly specialized products where air transportation is the only viable option.

Contracted Service

Commodities We Ship



General Cargo

General cargo encompasses items that do not fall into special cargo categories and do not require extra precautions or specialized handling during air transport.



Perishables

Perishable cargo includes items that are time-sensitive and require specific temperature control or special handling to maintain their quality during air transport, such as fresh produce, seafood, dairy products, and flowers.



Pharmaceuticals

Pharmaceutical shipments include susceptible medical products such as vaccines, medications, and biologics that require stringent temperature control and handling to maintain their efficacy during transport.



Oversized/Project Cargo

Oversized and Heavy Freight includes large machinery, construction, oilfield equipment, vehicles, and other bulky items exceeding standard size and weight limits for typical air cargo.



Human Remains

Human Remains cargo services provide respectful and secure transportation for the remains of loved ones, ensuring a dignified and compassionate journey.



Valuable/Fragile

Valuable Cargo services involve the secure transportation of high-value items, such as precious metals, gemstones, currency, luxury goods, artwork, important documents, or items of substantial or sentimental value.



Live Animals

Live Animals and Poultry cargo services involve transporting living creatures, including pets, zoo animals, horses, livestock, and poultry, requiring the highest level of care, handling, and expertise.



Dangerous Goods

Dangerous Goods refer to items or materials that pose risks to health, safety, property, or the environment and require specialized handling during air transport. These include chemicals, flammable liquids, gases, explosives, batteries, and other regulated substances.
